



Doctoral Student Survey Award

- *Eligibility:* Current doctoral students who are members of the DPOP.
- *Nominations:* Students will self-nominate by submitting a five-page proposal that describes their research question, the relevant existing research and theory, and their study design. The proposals must also contain an appendix listing the question wording and procedures to be used. (Although the proposals must be authored only by doctoral students, students may collaborate with faculty on any resulting research articles).
- *Evaluation Criteria:* Developed in 2022, this award is designed to fund survey research for a doctoral student. The winning proposal will earn \$1,000 to collect survey data over the next year, with the findings to be presented at the ASC Annual Meeting the following year.



Distinguished Scholar Award

- *Eligibility:* Scholars at least 10 years post-PhD; Can include faculty or practitioners; Requires membership in the DPOP.
- *Nominations:* Must come from the DPOP membership via a nomination letter, and include letters of support from research partners/mentees/colleagues and the nominee's CV.
- *Evaluation Criteria:* This award recognizes lifetime scholarly achievement in the field of POP. It honors public opinion/policy scholars who have made significant contributions to the field of POP as well as to the DPOP, including scholarship (publication, data, funded research), teaching/mentorship to students and young career scholars, and service to the DPOP.



Young Scholar Award

- *Eligibility:* Scholars within 6 years of receiving their doctorate; Can include faculty or practitioners; Requires membership in the DPOP.
- *Nominations:* Must come from the DPOP membership via a nomination letter, and include the nominee's CV.
- *Evaluation Criteria:* Research contributions (e.g., publication, data collection, funded research) as well as service to the DPOP and community in public opinion/policy research (e.g., invited presentations/panels, engagement with DPOP).



Scott Duxbury is an Assistant Professor of Sociology at the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill. His public opinion research focuses on the role of the public opinion in shaping the racial politics of mass incarceration. It has appeared in *American* Sociological Review, Social Forces, and Public Opinion Quarterly. His on-going research examines how political polarization has affected policy networks connecting state actors, especially with respect to reduce rates of crime, policy collaboration, crime policy passage, and decreases in the incarceration rate. Outside of policy and public opinion, he carries out an active research agenda on criminal networks, big data policing, darknet drug trafficking, and social network methods. His work on these topics have appeared in Criminology, American Journal of Sociology, Social Problems, Sociological Methodology, and Sociological Methods & Research, among other outlets, and has been funded by the National Science Foundation. His forthcoming book *Longitudinal Network Models* provides a lay-of-the-land for practitioners interested in navigating the range of tools available to analyzing longitudinal network data.

Vice Chair

- 1. Term of office for the Vice-Chair shall be two years.
- 2. The Vice-Chair shall preside over Division meetings in the absence of the Chair and shall be empowered to conduct all necessary business of the Division if the office of Chair is vacant or if the Chair is unable to serve.
- 3. The Vice-Chair or their designee shall chair the Awards Committee for duration of their two year term.
- 4. The Vice-Chair or their designee shall chair the Constitution and By-Laws Committee for duration of their two year term.

Executive Counselors - 2

- 1. There will be four Executive Counselors, elected in alternating years. Two Executive Counselors will be elected on even years and two on odd years.
- 2. Term of office for each Executive Counselor shall be two years.
- 3. Each Executive Counselor will chair one of the Standing Committees: Communications, Nominations, Program, or Publications.
- 4. All Executive Counselors will assist the Division Chair with executive decisions for the Division.
